The meeting was held in a virtual/in-person format in the Mid-East Commission Conference Room located at 1502 N Market Street, Suite A in Washington, NC. The following were present:

#### CALL TO ORDER & QUORUM

A quorum was established for both the TAC & TCC. TCC Chairman Alligood called the TCC to order at 11:09 AM. TAC Chairman Bond called the TAC to order at 11:10 AM.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion by TCC Chairman Alligood, seconded by Jerry McCrary, the TCC voted unanimously to approve the agenda. On motion by TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin, seconded by John Rebholz, the TAC voted unanimously to approve the agenda.

## APPROVAL OF 08/09/2022 & 09/13/2022 MEETING MINUTES

Sam Singleton informed TCC Chairman Alligood that the minutes for the August 9, 2022, special-called meeting would need to be approved by the TCC in addition to the September 13, 2022 regular meeting minutes as the TCC did not vote at the September 13, 2022 meeting due to a lack of quorum.

On motion by Mitchell Manning, seconded by Jerry McCrary, the TCC voted unanimously to approve the August 9, 2022, Special-Called & September 13, 2022 Regular meeting minutes. On motion by TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin, seconded by John Rebholz, the TAC voted unanimously to approve the September 13, 2022, Regular meeting minutes.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Ferrell Blount of Pitt County spoke to members of the TCC & TAC about the proposed upgrade of NC-11/US-13 between Greenville and Bethel. Mr. Blount stated that this route was designated as a strategic corridor by the State of North Carolina several years ago due to its connection to the Port of Norfolk in Virginia. Mr. Blount proposed the elimination of at-grade crossings, and the construction of interchanges and service roads to bring the route to freeway standards. He continued by saying that northern Pitt County will soon see major development like southern Pitt County and expressed concern that NC-11/US-13 would be hard to upgrade after this occurs due to right-of-way costs and public opposition. TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin asked if right-of-way has already been purchased by NCDOT north of Bethel towards US-64. Jeff Cabaniss answered that it has. Mr. Blount said, "I don't have a crystal ball, but I'm sure that in five years, we're gonna look at this area and ask what happened?". Further, Mr. Blount emphasized that "we must get ahead of this".

Sam Singleton thanked Mr. Blount for coming to speak about this proposal. Mr. Blount thanked the RPO for their work and excused himself.

TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin asked Sam Singleton what needs to happen next. Mitchell Manning said, "I feel we need to make a motion". TCC Chairman Alligood asked TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes what comments he has as a representative of Pitt County. TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes said that Pitt County certainly supports this project. He continued by mentioning the feasibility study (H150861) that was



completed for this project a few years ago, and asked Jeff Cabaniss and other staff from Division II to speak on how far along the feasibility study got, and what process needs to occur for the plan to go through the standard Prioritization process. Mr. Cabaniss said that he spoke with staff from the NCDOT Feasibility Studies Unit, who stated that they are poised to start back on the feasibility study. Mr. Cabaniss continued by stating that the FSU will need a letter from the RPO requesting the reactivation of the study. Mr. Cabaniss said that the feasibility study would not take very long, and that once it is complete, we will have updated cost estimate numbers to help with Prioritization 7.0. He mentioned that he spoke with Sam Singleton & TCC Chairman Bond recently and informed them that the Division would be willing to include this project in the Division Needs Category to help achieve a higher score.

TCC Chairman Alligood asked TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes if the TCC should vote for the RPO to send a letter to the NCDOT Feasibility Studies Unit requesting reactivation of H150861. TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes made the motion with Mitchell Manning seconding. The motion was passed unanimously by the TCC. TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin motioned to approve the recommendation from the TCC and Glorestine Brown seconded. The motion was passed unanimously by the TAC.

Sam Singleton asked if the request needs to be sent to RK&K or The NCDOT FSU. Mr. Cabaniss said that it needs to be sent to Derrick Lewis with the NCDOT FSU. Mr. Singleton said that he will send the request letter in the next few days.

#### MERPO STAFF REPORT

Sam Singleton gave an update on the Washington-Greenville Greenway Feasibility Study. Mr. Singleton said that the selection committee conducted interviews with potential consultants in September and after, voted unanimously to hire McAdams as the consultant for the study. Continuing, Mr. Singleton said that the Selection Committee met again to finalize the project scope. He said that the RPO then began contract and cost negotiations with the firm, which ended in late November. Mr. Singleton said that the RPO is now waiting for cost proposal approval from the NCDOT Office of Inspector General. A project timeline was then presented to the TAC & TCC. The floor was then opened for questions.

Jerry McCrary asked Mr. Singleton if the project would take 12 months in which he answered yes. TCC Chairman Alligood asked Mr. Singleton if the local match for the study needed to be paid upfront and also asked when it will need to be collected by. Mr. Singleton responded by saying that he will ask Bryant Buck (MEC Executive Director/MERPO Staff) about that but said that he expects the invoices for the match to be issued to the local governments in the coming weeks. Eliud De Jesus asked Mr. Singleton if he could send the contract for the study to all local governments paying a share of the local match. Mr. De Jesus said that the City of Greenville would like to review the contract before paying. Mr. Singleton said that he will send a copy to him. Mitchell Manning told Mr. Singleton that he has had conversations with individuals at the (East Carolina University) School of Business, who informed him that some students performed a transportation-related study several years ago. Mr. Manning asked Mr. Singleton if this would be helpful if he could get a hold of it. Mr. Singleton said yes and thanked Mr. Manning. Mr. Singleton mentioned that the RPO will have at least one student intern from the ECU RISE29 program assisting with the study.

Mr. Singleton presented the FY 2023-24 Mid-East RPO budget allocation from NCDOT to members of the TAC & TCC. He stated that the allocation remained the same as the current fiscal year (\$132,969.00).



Sam Singleton presented the timeline for the upcoming Prioritization 7.0 Cycle. He informed members of the TAC & TCC that more details will be discussed at the next regular meeting.

Sam Singleton presented an updated meeting schedule for the remainder of FY 2022-2023 to members of the TAC & TCC.

Mitchell Manning thanked members of the RPO for their work.

#### DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION

TCC Chairman Alligood entertained any discussion. Hearing none, the item was turned over to the TAC. TAC Chairman Bond entertained any discussion. Gloristine Brown informed members of the TAC & TCC that she has been elected to the North Carolina General Assembly and will be relinquishing her seat on the TAC. She asked what steps need to be taken to replace her seat. Sam Singleton responded that since she is a member of the TAC, her seat will need to be filled by her county's (Pitt) Board of Commissioners. Mrs. Brown thanked members of the TAC & TCC for all of their work. Mr. Singleton thanked Mrs. Brown in return for her service to the RPO. TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes informed both committees that TAC Representative Alex Albright did not seek reelection to the Pitt County Board of Commissioners, and has relinquished his seat on the TAC. He continued by saying that Mary Perkins-Williams was elected as Chair of the Pitt County Board of Commissioners the previous night, and that her committee appointments will be announced in early-January.

#### NCDOT DIVISION II UPDATES

Len White, Division II Planning Engineer, gave updates on current projects underway in Beaufort & Pitt Counties. Mr. White went into detail on several resurfacing projects, the scheduled letting of an RCI project near Beaufort County Community College, the scheduled letting of a round-a-bout project at the intersection of US-264 & NC-32, and the repairing of the damaged Mozingo Road bridge over I-587 in Pitt County.

John Rebholz asked Mr. White if there has been any change to the scheduled completion date of B-5302 (Replacement of Bridge #3 over Norfolk Southern Railroad over US-17 BUS and improvements to Bridge #25 on US-17 BUS over the Pamlico River). Mr. White said that there has been no change that he is aware of, and that it is still scheduled to be completed by November/December 2023.

TCC Chairman Alligood asked Jeff Cabaniss, Division II Engineer about the proposed improvements to the intersection of US-264 & NC-92 and whether it has been submitted to Haywood Daughtry (NCDOT Traffic Safety Unit) for safety funding. Mr. Cabaniss said that it has not officially been received yet.

TCC Vice-Chairman Rhodes asked Mr. Cabaniss if there are any new updates on the Tar River crossing on NC-222. Mr. Cabaniss said that the project has been pushed back due to the need for a new alignment and also said that "they have shelved it and it will be pushed back several years".



#### NCDOT DIVISION I UPDATES

Craig Midgett, Division I Planning Engineer, gave updates on current projects underway in Martin County. Mr. Midgett went into detail on several programmed projects and gave cost estimates, and let dates. Mr. Midgett briefly went over the expected let date of R-5810 (Access management on US-17 from SR-1119 to SR-1205). Continuing, Mr. Midgett gave updates on projects currently under construction and informed the committees that R-2511 (US-17 Widening to Multi-Lanes from NC-171 to South of Williamston) is on schedule, with a completion date of 1/28/2027 and that R-4705 (SR-1142 Modernization) remains on schedule for a completion date of 11/28/2025. He also gave an update on I-6028B & I-6028C. Mr. Midgett stated that the Division (1) is working on several ADA projects in specific municipalities in Martin County and briefly went over several resurfacing projects.

TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin expressed her concern with the surface conditions of SR-1113 near Deadwood in the Bear Grass area. Mr. Midgett replied that he will look into the issue and see what the status is.

Concluding his presentation, Mr. Midgett gave a brief overview of several Pavement Preservation projects that are scheduled for Martin County.

Jerry McCrary asked Mr. Midgett about the status of a potential grant to repair roads in the Town of Parmele. Mr. Midgett said that he would find out.

#### NCDOT TPD UPDATES

Liamcy Hogan-Rivera, NCDOT TPD Transportation Engineer II, gave updates from the NCDOT Transportation Planning Division. Ms. Hogan-Rivera gave a status update on the Pitt County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) update and spoke on the recent public involvement sessions that took place. Additionally, she mentioned the webpage materials available for the CTP update. Continuing, Ms. Hogan-Rivera gave updates and information about the Statewide Freight Plan & the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan and informed both committees that the 2021 Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) numbers have been released. Ms. Hogan-Rivera concluded her presentation and asked the committees to contact her with any questions.

Sam Singleton thanked Ms. Hogan-Rivera and said that the RPO is happy to have her back.

### **FURTHER DISCUSSION**

TCC Chairman Alligood asked if there were any questions from members of the TCC. Eliud De Jesus asked if an update could be given at the next regular meeting on the status of the Passenger Ferry Feasibility Study being conducted by the NCDOT Ferry Division and North Carolina State University. TCC Chairman Alligood told Mr. De Jesus that the last locally held conversations with the Ferry Division & NCSU were during a site visit in Beaufort County. Sam Singleton told Mr. De Jesus that he will gather more information from the Ferry Division & NCSU about the study and will email him his findings.



TCC Chairman Alligood asked Jeff Cabaniss and Division II staff if U-5860 (15th Street Improvement Project) was moving forward as expected. Mr. Cabaniss said that he received a letter the day before from the City of Washington stating that they support the project with some caveats. John Rebholz asked Sam Singleton if he received a copy of the letter from the City of Washington, Mr. Singleton said that he did not directly receive the letter and he was forwarded the letter by Mr. Cabaniss. TCC Chairman Alligood said to Mr. Cabaniss "so that was just yesterday?" in which Mr. Cabaniss replied "yes". TCC Chairman Alligood said "so I guess from the RPO side, it sounds like we're right back to where we were before" and continued by stating "is that where we are Jonathan (Russell)?". Mr. Cabaniss said that he has a question on one of the caveats which he needs to clarify with the City (Washington). Mr. Cabaniss said, "If you're going to go into design, you can't have fuzzy" and further elaborated on ways to clarify what the City of Washington is asking for. TCC Chairman Alligood said that he wanted to ensure that the RPO was clear in the fact that the RPO was not going to support any issues that would stop U-5860 from moving forward. TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin added "and also make it clear that we (the RPO) were okay with the original NCDOT design to start with". Mr. Rebholz asked Mr. Singleton if he shared the same concerns as TCC Chairman Alligood. Mr. Singleton stated that if the TAC & TCC both support the original NCDOT project, then that is what RPO staff will support. Continuing, Mr. Singleton mentioned the many flaws that were discussed with the City-Hired Consultant's (Stantec) plan to implement a road diet on 15th Street and said "we all saw how the adjusted plan would negatively impact the City of Washington and Beaufort County" and added "Making it (15th Street) a three-lane road would turn it into a parking lot". Mr. Singleton concluded by saying that the RPO stands ready to do whatever is necessary to move U-5860 forward. Mr. Rebholz asked Mr. Singleton if they (Washington City Council) voted on this letter recently. Mr. Singleton responded that the letter was voted on at their September 12, 2022 meeting. Mr. Rebholz said, "and they're just getting the letter to you now?" in which Mr. Singleton responded "yes". TCC Chairman Alligood told Mr. Cabaniss that the action taken by the RPO was to support the original design, and that if there is an opportunity to incorporate some of the (Stantec Plan) items, to do so. Continuing, he stated "My assumption was that it was not to slow down the project, but I think from what I'm hearing, there seems to be some slow down based on the understanding of what's being expected and what's already being done". Mr. Cabaniss informed the members of both committees that NCDOT has not re-hired the design firm yet, as they don't want to spend tax dollars to "run in circles". Continuing, Mr. Cabaniss emphasized that he wants to "get an understanding" between the City of Washington and NCDOT before the project starts and added "If the City can't support the project, then we're going to ask the RPO to go back to the drawing board and design another project to free up that money, because right now, it's just sitting there and we can't do anything with it". Mr. Cabaniss also stated that the project is "locked in" and can't be dropped unless the RPO and Division agree to it. Mr. Cabaniss also expressed his concern with the language of the caveats in the City of Washington's letter. TCC Chairman Alligood said "again, my understanding from DOT is that they will not move forward with a project unless it's supported by the municipality" in which Mr. Cabaniss responded "yes, because of the utilities". TCC Chairman Alligood said "so it sounds like we're back where we were several months ago still" and added "Jonathan are you still on (The Zoom Call)? Does anyone from the City of Washington want to address that? What are the concerns that were not clarified? Anybody? Mike Dail responded "we're here, but I really can't speak to it. You're gonna have to talk to Jonathan". TCC Chairman Alligood replied by saying "Alight guys, we've got a project that's scheduled to move forward, and DOT's ready to pull the money on it, and we're playing games".

TAC Chairman Bond asked members of the TAC if there was any further discussion needed. TAC Vice-Chairwoman spoke on the State's 2023 Year of the Trail initiative and emphasized the importance of it. Mitchell Manning asked TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin if she would help him promote the Year of the Trail initiative with the Wright Flight program for elementary students in Martin County.



Mr. Rebholz asked Mr. Cabaniss how we are going to move U-5860 forward. TAC Vice-Chairwoman said "I think the bottom line is this: we've been very patient, and we've tried everything we can to help get this thing moving. You're (NCDOT) sitting on a pot of money that could effectively be used somewhere else. We want to see the project done and the RPO has given their permission and at this point, unless you come up with something major, I'm not about to change my mind. Ok? Everyone knows that in this room. So anyways, you (City of Washington) either get this mess straightened out and come to the table, or we're (NCDOT/MERPO) gonna take this money somewhere else. We're gonna take our baseball, glove, and bat and play in another field". Mr. Singleton reminded members of the TAC & TCC that the deadline to swap projects in the current STIP is March 17, 2023 and said "If we don't have the support of the City on this project, we can swap this project out with another, and this money can go elsewhere in the RPO". Mr. Rebholz asked Mr. Cabaniss what steps need to be taken to connect him to Mr. Russell. Mr. Cabaniss replied by saying

"We've had a lot of meetings in the past, but none recently with the City Council. I think we need to have a work session, lay out the plans, and actually understand what exactly they're asking for". TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin asked Mr. Cabaniss if there would be any benefit having RPO representation at a potential work session with the Washington City Council. Mr. Cabaniss said, "This is the first time we've ever dealt with a project like this, so I don't know". TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin stated that having the TAC and TCC Chairmen at a potential work session with the Washington City Council would be very beneficial. TCC Chairman Alligood said that a similar meeting to what she was referring to was already held in August, and that he was under the impression that everything was clear after that meeting. Mitchell Manning said that the TAC & TCC Chairmen need to be at the potential meeting. TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin said "We want to help you any way we can, Jeff (Cabaniss). You're in a bad place right now". Mr. Cabaniss said "Our (NCDOT) job is to maintain and build safe infrastructure, so we're not going to deal with a facility with issues that have proven to not be as safe as the original project. Mr. Rebholz asked Mr. Cabaniss if some of the changes requested by the City of Washington will make the project less safe in which Mr. Cabaniss responded "potentially. One of the things we heard several years ago when they (City of Washington) told us that they didn't want the project was that they didn't want to impact people coming out of the side streets and that they wanted people to be able to turn left and not have to turn right and make a U-Turn. So one of the statements in there (the letter) kind of alludes to that but it doesn't expressly say it, so that's what I'm not sure about" and continued by saying that the City also requested complete streets incorporation, Bike/Ped accommodations, sidewalks, trees, and other aesthetic items and said "All of that is fine". Mr. Singleton added that right-of-way acquisition was another original concern held by the City of Washington, but that it was made clear in the letter to the City sent by Mr. Cabaniss that no matter what, right-of-way had to be taken in some capacity. Mr. Cabaniss added that adding additional right-of-way is necessary for moving/upgrading utilities, which will be done at no cost to the City of Washington. Jonathan Russell stated that he was briefly off the zoom call during the discussion about 15<sup>th</sup> Street, and added that he had recently spoken to Mr. Cabaniss about the language in the letter. Mr. Russell stated "I think the letter states that where possible to limit left-turn restriction, but I think we've got some room to amend that if we need to. I think that during the planning process, we can look at each intersection and see how that would be treated". TCC Chairman Alligood responded to Mr. Russell, saying "Jonathan that's not in the City of Washington's ability to design each of the intersections for DOT. DOT's going to design that in a manner which is safe overall, and I wouldn't think there would be any intersections except for controlled intersections with lights, where anyone would be making left-turns". Mr. Manning said, "my understanding was that we were gonna try to throttle down traffic". TCC Chairman Alligood asked Mr. Russell "Jonathan, how can y'all put something together with Jeff (Cabaniss) to straighten that out?". Mr. Russell answered "I mean, we can change that language on that last sentence. I think that was just some of the neighborhood concerns and I think that was some of the concerns on the first go-around. I don't know if that was one particular area, but again,



like you said Brian (Alligood), if DOT's designing through there and if it's a non-negotiable point, then that would need a resolution at the time". TCC Chairman Alligood asked Mr. Russell "Is that a letter you've got to change, or does it go back to City Council?" who responded, "We can probably look at the language and see what would be acceptable but what does Jeff (Cabaniss) need to see?". TCC Chairman Alligood answered "Jeff (Cabaniss) needs to see that DOT can design the road without left turns, except at controlled intersections. When you have stop lights, they'll make left turns, but otherwise, those side streets, you can't make left turns because you have a median. Mr. Singleton told Mr. Russell that NCDOT needs explicit language, saying that the City of Washington supports and endorses U-5860. In response to Mr. Singleton, Mr. Russell said "We don't have a layout of how the project's going to look at this time". To Mr. Russell, TCC Chairman Alligood said "I hear the concerns that residents and members of the City Council have about still being able to make left turns, and what I hear Jeff (Cabaniss) clearly saying is that for the safety of the project, left turns are not going to be restricted at controlled intersections with stop lights". Mr. Russell stated, "General consensus from Council is that we support the project". TCC Chairman Alligood asked Mr. Russell if he can change the letter sent from City Council and Mr. Russell said that he feels comfortable changing the letter. Mr. Manning suggested to Mr. Russell that he send the updated letter to Mr. Cabaniss by Friday, in which Mr. Russell said, "That's doable". Mr. Manning said, "Good job".

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

On motion by Jerry McCrary, seconded by Mitchell Manning, the TCC voted unanimously to adjourn at 12:24 PM.

On motion by TAC Vice-Chairwoman Griffin, seconded by John Rebholz, the TAC voted unanimously to adjourn at 12:25 PM.







# Passenger Ferry Feasibility Study Status Report

- -The North Carolina State University Institute for Transportation Research & Education has been conducting a passenger ferry feasibility study for several routes along the NC coast for the past 1-1/2 years. This study is being performed in coordination with the NCDOT Ferry Division. One of the routes being analyzed would connect Washington/Beaufort County to Ocracoke Island.
- -In 2022, several public input meetings were hosted by NC State ITRE. The Pamlico Sound/Pamlico River public input meeting was held in June 2022 in Swan Quarter. At this meeting, information was presented, and members of the public and staff from Local Governments were invited to ask questions.
- -RPO Staff was notified by the Ferry Division in late-2022 that NC State ITRE is expected to complete the final report for the study in the first half of 2023.
- -This is a research project and is limited to studying and documenting the feasibility of potential passenger ferry routes. There are no plans or funding in place to expand passenger ferry service or to construct new terminals.
- -The study may be used in the future by Local/Regional/State agencies or the private sector to plan for and/or implement a passenger ferry route. Although there are no efforts currently in place.
- -Once the study is officially completed, RPO Staff will analyze the study's findings, and will discuss with the TCC & TAC at the next meeting.
